

Crusader Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct

The following policies regarding the conduct of Central Maryland Christian Crusaders parents/guardians are being established in support of the Player Code of Conduct. We need parental support and participation as we seek to develop quality young men and women through team sports. In consideration of your support of this Crusader Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct. Some players will soon be, or are in, a position to try out for, or are hoping to, play/cheer in college. They need to understand that playing time, positions, athletic ability, effort, attitude, development, and discipline are all key ingredients in how the coaching staff will determine the roster prior to and during any game.

- I understand that I am a representative of the CMCC and all that I do in public can bring credit or discredit to my child's team.
- I will endeavor to uphold the high standards and ethics of the CMCC, and realize that the ministry and message of Jessu can be affected by what I say and do.
- I will ensure that the reputation of CMCC is upheld and kept clean.
- I will encourage my child to play clean and fair.
- I will not punish my child by removing him/her from practice or games due to misbehavior at home.
- I will ensure that my child comes to all practices and games.
- Be supportive and reinforce all elements of the Player or Cheerleader Code of Conduct.
- Please let the coaches instruct and position players and handle running of the game.
- Don't complain about things like officiating, field conditions, the coaches' decisions, game circumstances, coaches and players on opposing teams, and playing time for your student
- If you have a complaint or problem with one of the coaches, work it out with that person directly. Do not let things escalate.
- If you have concerns regarding the team and how it's being run, bring them to one of the coaches, the athletic director or another board member.

Inappropriate Conduct

The following **WILL NOT** be tolerated:

- Allowing a player to leave the sideline to sit with you (except in emergency situations). Be sure to provide your player or cheerleader with ample amounts of fluids and snacks to sustain them throughout the game to eliminate the need to leave during the competition.
- Questioning playing time.
- Use of crude, profane, or vulgar language.
- Critical, judgmental, or negative talk directed toward teammates, CMCC coaching staff, and opposing team's coaching staff and players.
- Outward displays of displeasure with the officials
- Consumption of alcohol and/or drugs.
